




## LATE DR. KALBE SADIQ SAHAB

By the grace of Almighty Allah, the Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust (TMT) continues its humble journey towards educational and social upliftment. What began in 1979 as a small effort to help one needy student has grown, through divine blessing and community support, into a movement serving hundreds. Our annual expenditure has risen from 86,000 to nearly 7 lakhs within a few years, reflecting both our expanding work and the faith of our donors.


During 1985–1986, we extended our activities beyond Lucknow by establishing branches in Delhi and Madras. The Delhi branch launched an ambitious programme to prepare students for the Indian Administrative Service under Mr. Saiyed Shariful Hasan Naqvi, though response remained limited. The Madras branch, however, earned wide appreciation for its sincerity and efficiency.

Financially, the year was challenging. Owing to the Iran-Iraq war, contributions from the Gulf decreased sharply, forcing us to delay the final instalment of stipends. Yet our students displayed remarkable patience, and most scholarships were disbursed fully. Only one instance of misconduct occurred, reminding us of the need for stricter verification.

We maintained close coordination with the Anjuman-e-Wazifa-e-Sadaat-wa-Momineen and established new links with the Imam-e-Zamana Mission, Hyderabad, whose free English-medium school for the poor deserves special praise. I also had the privilege of meeting Mulla Asghar M. M. Jaffer, President of the World Khoja Federation, who commended our work and offered cooperation.

I have long advocated that our religious gatherings—Majalis-e-Aza—be used as platforms to promote education. If our preachers emphasize knowledge and reform, real change can follow within years. Although this effort has yet to gain full momentum, it remains central to our vision.





Social welfare activities also continued. We distributed clothing and shoes through the generosity of Dr. Abbas Jafri (USA), arranged limited overseas employment, provided medicines to hospitals, and offered interest-free loans. Collaboration with the ICIC Foundation enabled three students to study abroad, while two technical institutes at Hyderabad and Naugawan Sadaat advanced vocational training.


I remain deeply grateful to our donors and workers in India and abroad, especially Mr. S. Ghulam Husain Zaidi for his devoted service, and our friends from the Mohammadi Trust, London, for their continued generosity. Though financial trials persist, our resolve remains firm.


May Allah bless all who support this mission. Together, through sincerity, sacrifice, and education, we can guide our community from weakness to strength and from ignorance to enlightenment.

There will be a celebration in heaven...



## SECRETARY'S DESK FROM THE

For over four decades, Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust (TMT) has remained steadfast in its commitment to advancing education for the underprivileged. The modest yet meaningful progress we have made over these years stands as a testament to the vision and dedication of our founder, Padma Bhushan Dr. S. Kalbe Sadiq, and his fellow cofounders. Their legacy continues to inspire our journey as we pursue the goals of quality education and holistic student development.

At TMT, we firmly believe that meaningful transformation in education cannot be achieved in isolation. Collaboration and networking with like-minded individuals and organisations are vital for sharing experiences, learning from one another, and replicating proven practices. Through collective effort, we aspire to nurture students who are intellectually competent, morally upright, and emotionally resilient—young minds prepared to meet the demands of an increasingly competitive world.



With this belief, I am pleased to present in this year's report a working plan developed by TMT to promote employability-driven, concept-based education. The initiative aims to enhance learning outcomes, integrate skills, employability and student awareness to better prepare them for the evolving challenges of the modern workplace.

We recognise that despite our sustained efforts. TMT's journey remains one of continuous learning and refinement. As an organisation, we remain to collaboration. open innovation, and constructive feedback. We invite educators, institutions, and individuals dedicated to student development to review, adapt, and implement the strategies outlined in plan—because improving educational outcomes is no longer a choice, but an urgent necessity in the face of rapid global change.

Various national studies and reports paint a concerning picture—over half of Indian children aged ten struggle to read or comprehend ageappropriate texts, with the challenge being particularly acute in states such as Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. According to the ASER report, barely half of Class 5 students can read a Class 2-level text, and fewer than one-third are able to solve basic arithmetic problems.

The secondary school dropout rate hovers around 11%, while failure rates in several state board examinations remain considerably higher than those in national boards.



The scenario becomes even more competitive in professional education, where only a minuscule fraction of aspirants succeeds in gaining admission to courses such as medicine, engineering, law, or civil services—success rates in some national-level entrance exams are as low as 0.1%.

These realities underscore the urgent need for reform. At TMT, we view education not merely as a means of academic success but as a comprehensive process aimed at equipping students with the knowledge, skills, and values required to lead meaningful and productive lives. Our approach to employability-driven holistic education seeks to balance intellectual, moral, physical, and emotional development, transforming students into confident, competent, and compassionate individuals.

Holistic development is achieved through a multi-dimensional framework that combines quality academics, moral training (Tarbiyat), sports, extracurricular activities, and healthy competition. We strive to deliver a curriculum that builds conceptual clarity, replaces rote memorization with understanding, and integrates moral and spiritual guidance to shape character and discipline. Students are encouraged to engage actively in physical education, creative pursuits, and inter-school competitions that foster teamwork, leadership, and resilience.

Academically, our efforts are directed toward strengthening the teaching-learning process. We have introduced student-centered, interactive methodologies and conduct regular teacher training to enhance classroom effectiveness. At different stages of schooling, the focus varies—from play-based literacy at the pre-primary level to communication and scientific reasoning at the primary level, and from rigorous subject mastery in secondary grades to career-aligned preparation at the senior secondary stage.

A crucial element of our educational approach is the integration of employability skills within the curriculum. From an early age, students are exposed to computer literacy, communication training, and personality development programs. Career counseling is initiated from Grade 7 onward, helping students make informed choices based on their interests and aptitude rather than societal pressures. Our career guidance team, assisted by external mentors and professionals, conducts sessions, field trips, and motivational interactions to broaden students' horizons and encourage them to pursue their goals with clarity and confidence. Students are also guided to explore entrepreneurship and prepare for competitive examinations for various government and professional roles.

This integrated model aims to create well-rounded individuals—those who are intellectually capable, morally grounded, emotionally balanced, and professionally ready to face the challenges of the future. Yet, as experience reminds us, the journey from planning to execution is never easy. While formulating a development plan is relatively straightforward, implementing it within a set timeline has proven to be an ongoing challenge. Development is a gradual process that demands patience, perseverance, and collective effort.

Among the major challenges we continue to face are changing the mindsets of students, teachers, and parents who are often hesitant to move out of their comfort zones; correcting the bias that places science above humanities and commerce; and combating the social stigma that undervalues vocational education. Another persistent issue is discouraging students from seeking degrees from substandard institutions that offer little real value. Additionally, finding sincere, committed, and skilled professionals willing to contribute selflessly to educational reform remains a significant difficulty. The cultivation of time management and discipline, along with navigating administrative and bureaucratic hurdles, adds further layers of complexity to our mission.

However, these challenges do not deter us. On the contrary, they serve as reminders of the realities we must face and overcome through resilience, teamwork, and faith in our shared purpose.

Looking ahead, we are eager to collaborate with individuals and organisations who share our commitment to holistic, employability-oriented education. By working together, we can replicate and scale impactful practices that empower students to succeed in an everchanging world.

As I conclude this report, I bow in gratitude to the Almighty, the Most Merciful, for blessing us with the strength, opportunity, and guidance to continue this noble mission. I extend heartfelt appreciation to our dedicated staff, whose unwavering commitment drives every initiative; to our donors and well-wishers, whose generosity sustains our efforts; and to all stakeholders who believe in our vision. Their faith and support remain the cornerstone of Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust's enduring journey toward educational and social upliftment.




Digital face-recognition biometric attendance systems and new LED displays were installed to enhance learning and discipline.







### ENSURING FOOD SECURITY FOR THE UNDERPRIVILEGED

The Food Aid Project by Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust (TMT) aims to combat hunger and support underprivileged families by providing essential uncooked food supplies.

Every year during the holy month of Ramzan, TMT distributes food packets to over 3,000 families, with a total budget of INR 5 million, ensuring that no family goes hungry. The most deserving destitute, who lack any other form of support, continue to receive food assistance throughout the year.

The project extends across Lucknow and other cities in Uttar Pradesh, including families whose children are enrolled in TMT's Unity Education Programme (UEP).

In addition, food packets are regularly distributed to the caretakers of pediatric cancer patients at King George's Medical University (KGMU). All food supplies are prepared under strict hygiene standards by approved vendors to maintain quality for every recipient irrespective of religion or background.





## IN MEMORIAM

### JUSTICE SYED HAIDER ABBAS RAZA (1939-2024)



The physical presence of towering figures may yield to the silent passage of time, yet their true legacy remains immortal, perpetually woven into the very fabric of society through the profound values they championed and the generations they influenced. Justice (Retd.) Syed Haider Abbas Raza was the embodiment of this truth—a distinguished jurist and leader whose steadfast commitment to the principles of justice, the power of education, and transparent governance leaves an indelible, luminous mark on the world he helped shape.

It is with profound sorrow that the Board of Trustees of Tauhedul Muslimeen Trust (TMT) honors the memory of Justice Raza, their esteemed and dedicated Vice President of TMT and a Vice President of Unity College, Lucknow. He departed on December 7, 2024, his life a testament to justice and public service.

A distinguished jurist and devoted public servant, Justice Raza dedicated his life to law, justice, and education. His judicial excellence and social activism enriched not only Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust and Unity College but also the broader community, inspiring generations.

Born on December 7, 1939, in Faizabad, he hailed from the revered family of Kichouchha Sharif, the dargah of Sufi Saint Makhdoom Syed Ashraf Jahangir Semnani. His father, Mehdi Hasan, a postmaster, ensured his children received the best education. After completing his early schooling in Faizabad, Justice Raza moved to Lucknow, where he studied at Government Jubilee Inter College and Lucknow University, actively engaging in student movements, debates, and public discourse.

Pursuing law, he joined the Bar in 1962, specialising in Service Labour, Civil, and Constitutional law. Actively involved in trade unions and politics, he held key roles, including General Secretary and President of the Lucknow Congress Committee, and defended Indira Gandhi before the Aligarh Enquiry Commission. However, he later withdrew from politics to focus on his legal career.

Elevated to the Lucknow Bench of the Allahabad High Court in 1988-89, he served 13 years, disposing tens of thousands of cases. His landmark rulings in Public Interest Litigation (PIL) transformed Lucknow—preserving Jhandewala Park in Aminabad, stopping political rallies at Begum Hazrat Mahal Park, relocating the old clothes market, and declaring Hazratganj a nodiesel-tempo zone, enhancing public life.

Following his retirement in 2001 as Senior Judge, he was appointed Uttarakhand's first Lokayukta, upholding transparency in governance. Honoured with the 'Pride of Uttarakhand Award' and 'Uttarakhand Ratna', he organised the All-India Lokayukta, and UP Lokayukta Conference in Dehradun, inaugurated by Dr APJ Abdul Kalam and Dr Manmohan Singh.

Even at 81, he remained active, mentoring young lawyers and engaging in political discourse. His presence exuded dignity, mirroring the principles he upheld.

Justice Raza is survived by his wife, Mrs Shahana Raza; his son, Syed Mahdi Abbas Raza, a telecom engineer; and his daughter, Prof Nishat Haider, Professor of English at Jamia Millia Islamia, married to Mr Kamran Rizvi, an IAS officer.

The Tauhedul Muslimeen Trust (TMT) and its allied institutions pay their highest tribute to Justice Syed Haider Abbas Raza, whose enduring legacy of unflinching commitment to justice, education, and governance continues to inspire.


