




# A REFORMER with a difference

Maulana Dr. Syed Kalbe Sadiq was an internationally renowned Islamic scholar, thinker, reformer, educationist and man of principles. He belonged to a reputed religious family of the subcontinent "Khandan-e-ljtihad". He was born in 1939 in the culturally rich city of Lucknow and left for his heavenly abode on 24<sup>th</sup> November 2020 after a prolonged terminal sickness at Era Hospital Lucknow. He was posthumously bestowed with Padam Bhusan an accredited national award in 2021.

He received his early education from the famous Madrasa of Sultan ul Madaris and

Nazmia in Lucknow. He then moved to Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh and obtained the degree of Ph.D. in Arabic Literature with a gold medal in 1971. Besides Arabic, Dr. Kalbe Sadiq had mastery over Urdu, Persian, English and Hindi languages. He was an orator par excellence and had traveled across the globe to deliver speeches and lectures on Islamic theology. He held the post of Senior Vice-President of India's biggest socio-religious organization known as All India Muslim Personal Law Board.

He was equally admired by the followers of all religions. Despite him belonging to the Shia



sect of Islam, he has been equally respected among all Islamic sects. Even after his death, he is seen as a big exponent of communal harmony between Hindu and Muslims and also Shias and Sunnis. Peaceful coexistence has been one of his basic principles of life. Earlier Lucknow was known for the sectarian violence between Shias and Sunnis particularly in the days of Muharram. But with the initiative and consistent efforts of Dr. Sadiq, several confidence building measures were taken up between the two communities and by the grace of God condition changed gradually. His widely recognized initiative was holding joint Shia-Sunni namaz on various religious occasions. Similarly, he organized all faith meetings and events where people from Hindu, Christian and Sikh religions had also participated. Dr. Kalbe Sadiq was also against the dominant thinking among Muslim leadership to advocate giving up the land where once Babri mosque stood in Ayodhya to the Hindu community for building a Ram temple if the Supreme Court so decided, much before the judgement came. He saw this as a goodwill gesture on part of the Muslim community which could win hearts of people from Hindu community. He was ready to sacrifice smaller interests for the sake of bigger gains like communal amity.

When Maulana Dr. Kalbe Sadiq stepped into the religious and social leadership of Muslim masses in mid 70s, he was moved by the pathetic condition of the community. The Muslim community in general and Shias in particular were backward in all fields and deeply sunk into the darkness of illiteracy, poverty and ignorance. He, after much deliberation, concluded that the root cause of the backwardness of Muslims lies in its distance from education and knowledge. From thereafter, Dr. Kalbe Sadiq resolved to spread education and knowledge on modern lines and waged a community wide war against illiteracy and ignorance. This became the aim of his life. He started an educational movement in the community and left no stone unturned to remove the darkness of ignorance.

On 18th April 1984, he established Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust (TMT) to give educational assistance and scholarships to the needy and poor students. Within the span of 36 years the Trust is running many schools, colleges, technical institutes, charitable hospitals, free education programs and providing scholarships to approximately 2,000 students every year. The amount of scholarship varies from thousands to lacs of rupees. Thousands of beneficiaries of TMTs scholarships, are now leading a successful life and bringing name and fame to their families and of course the community all over the world. It can be safely said that after Sir Syed Ahmad Khan, no Muslim leader has made as much efforts to spread modern education and scientific temperament in Muslim society as Dr. Kalbe Sadig did. It is for the same reason that people rightly called him to be a 'second Sir Syed'.

Maulana Dr. Syed Kalbe Sadig viewed Islam to be a complete and final version of the same truth which was revealed in different partial versions in earlier times. It is a comprehensive and practical way of life encompassing all aspects of human life be it spiritual, social or ethical. Dr. Sadig strongly held that Islam is a religion of rationality and reason and therefore leaves no scope for blind ritualism. He had been one of the staunch opponent of the orthodox principles of Islam and had warned the masses on countless occasions not to perform acts and rituals without understanding their significance because this will result in false feeling of religious arrogance and superiority complex. He had always emphasized that religion is a means to reform and beautify human character. If the character of a Muslim is not attractive, he should not be called a true Muslim. Likewise he had also made it clear in many speeches that Islam is the religion of knowledge and thus it encourages research and debate. The realities and doctrines of Islam are open for every human being to testify first and then accept. Maulana Dr. Kalbe Sadiq also portrayed Islam many times to be a religion of ease. Islam, according to him, has come to make human life easy, not difficult. It does not create problems rather it solves them. If a person tries to serve God and humanity and pray with purity, his little worship will be more valuable in the sight of Allah than hard spiritual exercises of other people. And lastly, Dr. Sadiq also termed Islam, on several times, to be the religion of justice. The goal of religion is to end all kinds of injustice, oppression and tyranny from the face of the earth. According to him, the real and ideal Islamic society is a society where no person is discriminated on racial, linguistic or economic grounds. In this context, he also condemned the prejudice against women. Dr. Kalbe Sadiq had always raised his voice in support of the rights of women and had taken concrete steps to safeguard them. He had paid special attention towards the education of girls which he considered to be the best way to empower them. He was an ardent champion for female education. One of his unfulfilled dreams was to establish a Women's Degree College in Lucknow in his life time.

Maulana Dr. Kalbe Sadiq is also known for his radical opposition of those so called Mullas whom he often calls "Kathmullas" whose activities are confined in creating hatred, disputes, differences and confusions. These so-called religious leaders, according to him, are giving to the community the slow poison of blind ritualism and stagnation and ultimately leading the community backwards. They have never come forward to fight against social evils like poverty, ignorance, superstitions, extravagances, costly marriages, dowry and unjustified divorces etc. They, according to him, are serving none but themselves and also are scared to lose their power, influence,

authority and above all, livelihood in case of the awakening and resurgence of the community. At the same time he always used to respect scholars and social reformers from all religions with high reverence.

Like all great personalities Dr. Sadig was known for his simplicity, politeness, morals and above all, his punctuality. All his events including functions, speeches and lectures always began on accurate scheduled time. It is because of these enlightening and liberal views regarding religion and society, he believed in inculcating scientific temper among people through modern education. One of his favourite topics during lecturing was Islam and Science. He went ahead boldly to announce sighting of new moon based on scientific calculations. In his own modest way he was always questioning religious orthodoxy. Going against the conservative Muslim society he supported the ban on Triple Talaq as he always advocated women empowerment. He also supported the idea of women performing namaz inside mosques. It is obvious that he was guided by reason and his conscience rather than any rigid rules of tradition. As a result, Dr. Kalbe Sadig has always been the target of criticism and objections from some extremists and ritualistic groups of the community but he never replied in words, he replied with action and results.

He believed in the oneness of human beings. Among the clergy of any religion, it is very difficult to find such a liberal person with progressive values. If all religious figures are to emulate him, there would be no religious strife in the country. Although he identified himself with Islam but his thought process included entire humanity. A truly religious person would always be large hearted like him.

In spite of being seriously ill, he went on a wheel chair to support the women who were protesting the Citizenship Amendment Act and National Register of Citizens in the winter of 2019-20 at Lucknow's main protest site at Ghantaghar. By this one act of his he clearly conveyed that religiosity doesn't mean being meek and submissive. One has to challenge evry injustice even if being done by the government. He had the moral courage to question the act of government and stand with the persecuted people. His final public act brought him close to Mahatma Gandhi, Martin Luther King and Nelson Mandela.

Dr. Kalbe Sadiq was a man with modern outlook and humanitarian inclination and will be known to posterity for creating educational and health care institutions. In human being's service he saw service to God like the Saibaba of Shirdi or Mother Teresa.

He truly belonged to an evolved genre of human beings. Human beings who have no malice towards anybody and neither does anybody hold any animosity towards them.

The intersection of Education and life-Janab's Timeline......


Excellence is never an accident; it is always the result of high intentions, sincere efforts, intelligent direction and skillful execution.

The Father Figure of the Unity Family was an internationally renowned Islamic scholar, a liberal thinker, a social reformer, a modern educationist, a philanthropic leader, a voracious orator and above all a great human being- 'A Messiah for the Downtrodden – *HAKEEM-E-UMMAT*.' He ardently believed that education shall eradicate poverty from the society and worked on ground with conviction. His exemplary life was dedicated to the welfare and progress of the society.

He gave his first sermon at the age of ten and soon became a popular orator. Earlier he followed the traditional practice but when he saw his community lagging behind in the field of education, he aggressively promoted education and awareness among the masses, besides the Islamic teachings and the mission of Ahlul Bait (A.S.).




The great son of Mother India, Janab, as he was fondly called, was born in the revered family of Lucknow- 'Khandan-e-Ijtehad'. His Father Umdatul Ulema Maulana Kalbe Husain Kabban Sahab marhoom was a renowned Islamic Cleric and Orator. His brother Maulana Kalbe Abid Sahab marhoom was also a theologian and prominent religious leader of the Shia Community. A very sharp, intelligent, witty and hardworking child, he was fond of education and learning. He got his early education from Madarsa-e-Nazmia and then Sadarul Afaazil from Sultanul Madaris.

He got married to Mohtarma Taj Sultana who is said to be the woman behind his success. She looked after his children in his absence and even in his presence; and managed the household chores single-handedly.

He earned Ph.D. (Arabic) after pursuing Graduation (B.A.) and Masters (M.A.) from AMU. The University recognized his excellent academic journey and conferred upon him a gold medal. Throughout his life he religiously followed punctuality. Not a single programme of his life ever got delayed, even by a minute. Mr. Raza Ali Abidi, a prominent broadcaster of BBC during his service, used a phrase 'Kalbe-Sadiq Standard Time' (K.S.T).

He laid the foundation of TMT to help the needy and deserving students and people of the community. Due to his patronage and support, thousands of children of the community are either in jobs within or outside the country or are pursuing businesses. Hundreds of families are getting medical aids, monthly rations Widow's Pension and Orphan's Educational Sponsorship. TMT seems to be the backbone for the community living in Lucknow in particular and Uttar Pradesh and some parts of the country in general.





without opening quality educational institutions it was nearly impossible to fulfill his dream of providing quality education at a nominal fee

to the students of both the genders. He established Unity College under the aegis of TMT. Janab faced a lot of opposition from a section of Maulanas, especially for establishing a co-education college. Lots of speeches and writings in various newspapers were published against him but that never depressed or disappointed him. He firmly continued on his mission with a positive mind-set like many other big personalities of history. He never bothered to reply or extend explanations to his critics.

Now Unity College has become one of the most prestigious institutions of Lucknow, with a special integration of Theology and Urdu into the modern curriculum. Dr. APJ Kalam, Former President of India, said, "Unity College is with a great mission."





Hiza Charitable Hospital was earlier established and funded by Ahlul Bayt Foundation in 1992. The hospital now runs under the administration of TMT. Since its inception, the hospital has been delivering low cost health treatment and preventive services primarily to the underprivileged people.

Patron-Unity College, Allahabad, Janab dedicated his whole life propagating the importance of education among Muslims and especially among Shias. His Sermons and Majlis of the early 90's stand witness for his emphasis on education, health and business.

He dedicated his whole life for religious (Hindu-Muslim) and sectarian (Shia-Sunni) Unity which is why he was an epitome of brotherhood and peace.









The night of 24th November, the world lost a great Alim, Janab Dr. Kalbe Sadiq Sb, the likes of which may never be seen again.

On 25th of November, 2020 thousands of mourners from transcending castes, communities, religions and sect barriers trooped out on the road to bid adieu to their dear Janab during his last journey. The year 2020 couldn't be worst. His popularity among the masses was immense.

A prominent Hindu News paper's heading was 'Farishta Chala Gaya'. The popularity that he earned was due to his great sense of service to humanity and his AKHLAQ.



His mission has to be taken forward with complete sincerity, conviction and honesty. His lifetime mission was to uplift the underprivileged ones through quality education and to promote Unity and Peace. His death will indeed be an irreparable loss to humanity but the legacy he has left behind and the trail of light of education and

brotherhood which he illuminated will keep on inspiring the multitudes. His last wish was to establish a Girls' Degree College

but unfortunately this remains a dream despite all his efforts. We pray that we are able to live up to his legacy. This shall be a true homage to him.

## GENESIS

All it took was an innocuous visit to a relative's home event culminating in the founding of the Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust. The story goes that Dr. Kalbe Sadiq was approached by an unknown man while visiting one of his relatives. The stranger requested him to accompany him to his shabby house, where he saw a child studying in the light of an oil lamp. "He's my son," the man said. "He is keen to study and extremely hardworking. However, I do not have the means to educate him. Dr Sadiq engaged with the boy over a chat and was duly impressed with the latter's intellectual abilities and diligence. Dr. Sadiq had the foresight to realize that given a chance, this young boy had great potential to academically excel, and become a means of uplifting his family out of poverty.

Without further ado, Dr. Sadiq wrote a letter to his Mumbai-based acquaintance, Late Mr. Jafar Ali Aseel, with a humble request to support the boy's education. Mr. Aseel graciously agreed to sponsor the child's education for two years. Thanks to this act of charity, the boy passed with very good marks. This incident opened Dr. Sadiq's eyes to the grim realization that there were many children from similar marginalized background who lacked the opportunity and access to basic education. He thus continued the work of identifying needy, deserving children and connecting them with altruistic friends and acquaintances who were willing to sponsor their education. However, it was also



becoming increasingly clear that this was a systemic issue faced by India's Muslim community, and needed a structured, longterm approach and intervention to achieve large-scale social impact.

this intention in mind. professionals from the educational sector were brought together in 1984 to form the Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust (TMT) - a nonmaterial upliftment of the under privileged community. The goal of the Trust calls for education as a means to rid the community of the entwined social ills of ignorance and poverty. Given its humble beginning, TMT's progress over the years has been nothing short of remarkable. As with any new venture, TMT's beginning was fraught with challenges - one being the regressive attitude of parents towards their children's education. Over time,

this shifted largely due to the awarness-raising efforts of TMT members and an innate understanding about the noble nature of the venture, which was not only professionally run right of several supporters from the community. A little more than a decade later witnessed the establishment of the Unity College Second Shift with an initial strength of nine students and an aim provide free education underprivileged and deserving children. Today, 34 years down the road, both Unity College and Unity College Second Shift boast an enviable enrolment of 3,500 students, a world-class

academic program, an expert faculty, and a state-of-the-art campus.

In addition to Unity College, TMT also runs other educational and medical institutions as well as charity programmes. As it transitions from one milestone to the other, TMT remains humbly and eternally grateful to the donors for their unwavering support which enabled our dream - to impact and elevate the lives of disadvantaged children through the invaluable gift of education - to manifest into reality.

**DESK** 

The COVID-19 pandemic presented an unprecedented challenge spreading across the world. It has not only led to a dramatic loss of precious human lives but also has a tremendous negative impact on education, public health, livelihood and economy across the world.

Each home and person has undergone remorseful and touching moments of losing near and dear ones to the pandemic. We have also lost some of the great personalities not only to covid and but also to non covid reasons. TMT family did not remain untouched and lost some most dedicated family members, a separate section in this report and Unity college magazine carries their obituaries as a token of respect to themthey shall always remain alive within us for the all good that they were.

Our sorrow was aggravated on losing our very own beloved Maulana Dr. Syed Kalbe Sadiq Sahab, who left us for his heavenly abode after a prolonged sickness of almost three years. He was not just a founder of Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust (TMT) and its projects, but the inspiration and moving spirit behind many other institutes like Era University.



This year's annual report has been dedicated as a humble homage to Dr. Kalbe Sadiq Sahab whose departure has left all of us equally afflicted with grief and sorrow. Efforts have been made by the editorial team to cover and preserve his lifetime achievements in the form of introductory writeup and a comment on his life journey. It was a pretty challenging task to capture the life and achievement of a personality, who was an institution in himself by virtue of being an internationally renowned Islamic scholar, thinker, reformer, educationist, man of principles and a big exponent of communal, interfaith and intrafaith harmony.

Dr. Kalbe Sadiq Sahab's lifetime guidance and establishments were a source of strength for us in facing these testing times in which coronavirus has inflicted our professional and private lives. Families have been seen

struggling to make ends meet. It was not only the academics that has been affected, there has been large scale loss of the global economy, productivity and livelihood.

Education has changed dramatically, with the distinctive rise of e-learning, whereby teaching is undertaken remotely and on digital platforms and it appears that these changes caused by coronavirus might be here to stay. I believe that the integration of information technology in education will be further accelerated and that online education will eventually become an integral component of school education.

With the advent of Covid 19 Schools, closed down around 20<sup>th</sup> March 2020, Unity school was able to shift the regular classroom teaching to online mode and probably was the first school in Lucknow that switched on to online teaching from the very next day. M U College Aligarh, Unity Private ITI (Industrial Training Centre), Unity Veda Institute along with other schools in the network under free education program also followed the trend and switched to online classes. With time all these schools/ Institutes are graduating from one level to another by regularly improving upon the delivery system, process, methodology and its management.

To minimize the monotony, schools actively promoted extracurricular activities along with regular curricular teaching, assessments and exams in online mode. Regular online

orientation and training sessions were conducted to familiarize teachers, students and parents on various issues related to online learning.

However, there are challenges as well. Elearning has its own limitations both for students and teachers. It becomes more challenging especially in our case where we are educating children from underprivileged or low-income group families as they are not equipped with proper hardware, cost of purchase of data package is high, data package cost is not affordable on ongoing basis, homes are small hence lot of cluttering effects their concentration level and parent being uneducated are of little help to students. Remaining hooked to online learning for students of pre-primary sections is even more difficult.

Efforts are being made to develop a robust integrated delivery system which is user friendly, effective, efficient, easy to monitor and operates taking into consideration affordability and connectivity issues faced by the majority of the families.

Fee default has been a major issue across all institutes during the reporting year. Process has been set to identify genuine cases, who have been unable to pay the fee due to loss of livelihood. All such genuine cases are being supported by TMT through its educational aid program. As a result, no student has dropped out due to non-payment of fees. On the other

side staff members were paid their salaries regularly and unlike other organizations and schools we did not retrench any of our staff members.

Due to lack of education and awareness, many parents took the detrimental decision not to allow their children to attend online classes as they thought that by doing so, they shall not be liable to pay the fee and get the mandatory promotion announced by the government. Schools are having regular counseling meetings with parents to minimize this damage to the students' learning.

Our programs like "Rahnuma" (Mentorship Program for students), "Tarbiyat" (guidance program for mothers), which were in their nascent stage got delayed. Our ongoing "Montessori system" and "student centered teaching" program for teachers also slowed down though a portion was done online. Partnership programs at vocational training level also took a back seat. We pray that the situation normalizes to give us an opportunity once again to start working on these programs actively.

TMT being the mother organisation was pretty active throughout the Covid period. TMT team worked day and night during covid period to provide food aid to 5000 underprivileged families. It also provided meals to labourers who were transiting Lucknow towards their home, after loss of livelihood from bigger cities. Medical aid, educational aid and

assistance to covid inflicted were stepped up.

Era Medical University and its team played a very crucial role in providing quality services to covid inflicted patients and it was a prime referral hospital for TMT team. HIZA charitable hospital through its outpatient services extended support to covid and non covid patients. We reach out with heartfelt appreciation and prayers not only for ERA or HIZA team but for the entire healthcare fraternity who worked globally risking their own life in a situation which had no established protocols.






## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**




### Number of Education Aid Beneficiaries 2019 - 2020




### Number of Education Aid Beneficiaries 2020 - 2021





## Amount paid for Education Aid 2019 - 2020

What began as a modest set-up in 1999 with just 17 students has metamorphosed into a full-fledged school with 1,300 students who receive free education as part of Unity College Second Shift's goal to provide equal educational opportunity to children irrespective of their financial backgrounds. Classes for Nursery all through to Intermediate (Class 12th) are held between 2-6 pm on weekdays with students having complete access to the entire academic and activity infrastructure available to their Unity College morning shift counterparts. Initially a Hindi Medium School the class are being gradually converted to English medium and till 2020 classes' up till IX have been successfully converted to English medium to cater to the demands of the globalized and competitive market.



#### **SALIENT HIGHLIGHTS**

- **★** 100% pass result in Class X and XII
- ★ Pre-primary and primary sections adopted English as medium of instruction.
- **★** Teaching taking place as per Montessori system in Pre Primary section of the school
- **★** Student-centered teaching (SCT) adopted in primary section.
- ★ Career counseling sessions by experts for Class X and XII students. Online Psychometric Personality Test was also conducted for them.
- \* Training of teachers by M/S. ASEEMA Mumbai on conducting effective online teaching.

Lucknow University. While some male students are pursuing engineering, fine arts, animation and multimedia.

#### **CHALLENGES**

- **★** Time constraint due to two shifts limits sports and computer literacy activities.
- \* Male students lagging behind the female students academically and in other curricular activities.
- ★ Being first generation to the school they don't get any support at home with homework, proper upbringing, health care and hygiene.
- \* Majority of the parentsare uneducated hence they lack refines, manners and knack to raise children.





#### **AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT**

- **★** English communication skills to be improved.
- **★** Quality of teachers needs to be enhanced through regular in-house training programs.
- \* Qualified and experinced English medium educated teachers to be hired to cater to English medium classes.
- ★ Need to develop a plan to enhance the overall academic performance and personality development of male students.
- **★** Plans to enhance participation in sports by organizing more inter-collegial sports events to foster sports excellence.
- \* Special program to be launched to educate mothers on upbringing of children in a proper manner.

# UNITY PVT. INDUSTRIAL TRAINING INSTITUTE (UPITI)

#### **ABOUT**

Founded in 1995-96, Unity Pvt. Industrial Training Institute (Unity Pvt. ITI) functions in a 30-room setup on the campus of Unity College to provide diverse vocational training courses to youth to support employability. There is continuous focus on improving the quality of training delivered in order to reflect the changing industrial trends while at the same time adhere to government guidelines. Initiatives in the pipeline include the construction of a new building exclusively for Unity Pvt. ITI; purchase of equipment as per latest QCI standards, working at grassroot level to counsel youth to opt for vocational courses as a path towards employability and the establishment of a dedicated placement cell.

The institute has 250 trainee enrollments in NCVT affiliated trades and 200 in short-term courses. Following courses affiliated with NCVT, Govt of India are available for training in the







Institute: Draughtsman (Civil), Computer Operator and Programming Assistant

(COPA), Sewing Technology, Stenography English & Hindi, Basic Cosmetology (formerly called Hair & Skin Care), Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Mechanic and Electrician.

Following short-term Courses are being offered – Fashion Designing, Beautician, Cutting & Sewing, Spoken English & Personality development, Autocad, Tally, Office Automation, DTP, CCC, C++, and Java etc. Regular sports, extracurricular activities, recreational, educational and Industrial tours are organized for the students.

#### **SALIENT FEATURES**

- **★** 100% pass results with students scoring more 75% on an average. 100% placement in all previous years. This year five pass out students have been appointed in different government.
- ★ Departments and corporations. In addition to MOU's signed with IL&FS and Godrej / Disha, this Institute is also in partnership with Cadd Centre, one of the leading institutes of cadd training in the country to provide best Auto CADD training to our Draughtsman Civil Trainees. Apart from Auto CADD, the training of 2D and 3D software has also been introduced in the course. Recently a batch of 18 trainees has received Auto-CADD (2D & 3D) training in the institute.
- ★ GODREJ Center of excellence was

- established in collaboration with Godrej / Disha in this institute is functioning superbly. More than 100 students have been trained and most of them are employed and the remaining are now self-employed after this training.
- \* Production Centre under the instructor of Cutting/Sewing short term courses is running smoothly where our pass out students are doing stitching work of uniforms and other garments and they are being paid as the skilled tailors are paid in our Tailoring Centre.
- \* Accreditation by NIELIT, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology is in operation. The Institute is authorized to register students for CCC course and many batches of CCC have successfully completed their training and one batch comprising of 15 students is under training.







#### **KEY OUTCOMES**

- **★** 100% pass results and 100% placement.
- \* Godrej Centre for Excellence imparting training in air-conditioning, refrigeration and home appliances has been established as part of UPITI.
- ★ Workshops upgraded with equipment as per revised NCVT norms and industrial requirements.
- **★** Industrial and academic partnerships in other vocations are in the pipeline.
- \* Many leading corporate namely Godrej, Daikin, Johnson Lifts, L&T Switch gears visited UPITI for recruitment and training in this institute,



#### **CHALLENGES**

- \* Development of New Campus on hold due to strained statutory requirements for seeking government approval of plan layouts.
- **★** Severe space constraints in the existing setup hampering development.
- \* Scarcity of trained instructors as per modern industrial requirements.
- \* Lack of awareness and eagerness among average and below average students to opt for vocational courses.









#### **AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT**

Need to invest in new and futuristic vocations that have high employability.

Design a campaign to raise awareness on vocational training to sensitize community on the value of skill-based learning.

Link a short course in entrepreneurship to make the students proficient in managing their own small businesses.

The second batch of 20 students passed their final exam this year and got employment in several reputed companies. U Veda Facilities have been updated as per Industry Standards and are continuously in the process of learning new software and technology. Nuke, Mocha, Silhouette and PF Track were introduced this year as Value Addition software.

#### **CHALLENGES**

- ★ Students generally come from remote areas with weak academics and poor communication skills particularly in English.
- Due to poor fee paying capacity of students and lower than optimal strength of students, MU College is a highly subsidized and deficit making institution, the deficit deepened severely due to COVID lockdown.
- The vision to develop students on ideological lines is yet to be achieved.



#### **AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT**

- \* Maximize the capacity of hostel through enrolment of meritorious students mainly in Grade V, VI and VII.
- \* Enhance awareness about the school and its quality facilities amongst Aligarh residents in order to increase enrolment of day scholars.
- \* English communications of students to be improved and conceptual knowledge in core subjects through remedial classes.
- \* Improve upon the level of commitment & efforts towards raising the standards of Ideological & spiritual development of the students.
- \* Narrowing down on deficit through cost control & enhancing enrolment of students.







#### UNITY EDUCATION PROGRAMME

#### **ABOUT**

Former UN General Secretary Kofi Annan once said "Education is the premise of progress, in every society, in every family". Reflecting this transformative power of education is TMT's Unity Education Programme (UEP), deserving students are selected in rural and urban areas and provided cost free education which includes uniform, stationary and transport. There is special focus on including parents' active participation in their children's education. An annual Quality Control Test (QCT) is conducted to evaluate and maintain quality education standards across schools. At present,

approximately 1400 students are enrolled in UEP schools excluding Unity College Second Shift which has around 1300 students.





#### **SALIENT FEATURES**

- ★ Enrollment of the students in English Medium Schools affiliated to State /ICSE and CBSE Board
- ★ Focus on value-based education
- \* In place of rote learning and facts learning, conceptual learning is focused to encourage understanding and dynamic learning systems rather than just organising and distributing data
- \* Career guidance is provided to students in Vocational and professional courses.
- \* Teachers' Training Programme, Students' Workshop/Counselling Sessions/Parents' Awareness Programme are organised on frequent basis.
- \* With the outbreak of Covid -19 all participating schools started online teaching though it was very difficult due to non-availability of hardware and connectivity.
- \* Organising of picnics/tours /excursion once in a year, but this year due to pandemic, it could not be done.

- \* Conducting of medical check-ups every year and providing the students/family members with proper medical treatment
- \* Rehabilitation Programme for deserving families was started but during COVID-19 most of the families had relocated themselves, therefore, it had to be discontinued.



#### **KEY OUTCOMES**

- ★ A total of 88 students appeared in X board exams 100% pass result with average aggregate marks scored by students 80% in 2021.
- ★ 82 students appeared in XII board exams 100% pass result with average aggregate marks scored by students 77% in 2021.
- ★ In QCT (Quality Control Test conducted by TMT) the average marks scored 47% against average of 66 % in home exams. As the home exams were held in online mode, students could easily secure more marks in it than that in QCT conducted in offline mode and keeping in view their academic standard this year, the result of QCT is satisfactory.

- **★** 43 students scored above 90% in QCT.
- **★** Target of 80% student attendance achieved.
- **★** 39 students achieved 100% attendance.
- **★** 2 students qualified the entrance exam of NEET.
- ★ 4 meritorious students got admission in AMU and 25 in Unity College, Lucknow.
- ★ Total of 123 students appeared for JEECUP21 (Vocational Training Entrance Exam for government polytechnics), 104 qualified the exam, 45 candidates have been selected for Govt. Colleges out of which only 12 candidates have taken admissions and the rest 33 left their seats for myriad personal reasons.
- **★** Students are also give vocational training/diploma courses at Unity Private ITI.









#### **CHALLENGES**

- ★ Unawareness of parents towards education leads to the entire onus of a child's development getting on UEP.
- \* Some parents want to send grown up children to add to the family's earnings rather than sending them to school. In most cases, as a girl turns 18, parents get hugely inclined towards their marriage. In this case, the continuity of the education of those students becomes a challenge for UEP.
- ★ We do not get good teaching staff and competent management in remote locations that directly affects the quality of education and to overcome it UEP has to supervise processes and uplift the quality through its own efforts.
- **★** Teachers lack in computer skills in rural areas.



#### **AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT**

- ★ To improve the communication skills of students and teachers in English
- ★ More emphasis to be given on computer skills
- ★ Teachers require more training sessions
- ★ More focus to be led on students' career counselling
- ★ Skill based learning requires to be promoted



- \* Computer classes to be run for skill development in rural areas.
- \* Counselling and guidance program to be launched for Parents.



#### **IMPACT**

- 1. Ms Bano was admitted to Lower Nursery in our partner school in 2004 in a small town of Uttar Pradesh. At that time we had no idea that this girl would grow up to secure 88% in the NEET exam and achieve a medical seat in a good Government Medical College of India. We are extremely proud that Bano did wonderfully well in her studies and her hard work has paid well. Her father, through private work, earns just enough to make the two ends meet. She is a great inspiration to several other students of her town whom she shall motivate and guide to achieve similar feat.
- 2. Ms. Hasan also comes from the same place as Bano and she also scored 87% in NEET. Hasan came in contact with the team of Unity Education Programme in 2015-16 and she was enrolled under our Free education programme. The girl worked hard and defying all odds, she qualified for a coveted medical seat in a Government Medical College. The family still lacks resources but the girl has made it big to ensure that the paucity may now start packing.



## **HIZA (A.S.) CHARITABLE HOSPITAL**

#### **ABOUT**

Hazrat Imam Zainul Abideen (HIZA) Charitable Hospital, set up in 1991, provides medicines at nominal rates to those below the poverty line without any discrimination on the basis of caste, creed or religion. Since HIZA operates exclusively in marginalized area which lack access to affordable and quality healthcare services. Its services are extremely beneficial for local residents. All services are free for widows, destitute, and orphans while other needy have to pay a nominal fee of Rs 6 towards consultation by a qualified doctor and medicines for one day. On an average 270 patients attend the OPD daily.





Additionally, immunization, diagnostic, and health and wellness awareness camps are routinely organized by HIZA. Microscopy DOTS Centre, a unit of WHO in collaboration with government TB Hospital, Thakurganj (Lucknow) is also running at HIZA. The Centre conducts sputum examination and provides quality anti- tuberculosis drugs free of cost. The launch of Homeopathy Centre is another success. There is also provision for the administering of First Aid to the injured.

The services of HIZA (AS) Charitable Hospital is supported is project of Al Iman Charitable Trust, Najafi House, Mumbai but under TMT management.

As part of its modernization drive, HIZA has computerized its operations for optimum efficiency.

Renovation and expansion are underway and soon the public shall have improved infrastructure, additional facilities and more consultants.

#### **MEDICAL AID PROGRAM**

#### **ABOUT**

The Ministry of Health, India, has estimated that a whopping 63 million people slip back to poverty every year due to "mounting" expenditure over healthcare which neutralizes the gains of rising income and various government schemes aimed to reduce poverty.

Tackling this serious issue of healthcare access and affordability is TMT's Medical

Aid Program was offers medical aid to underprivileged through a network of hospitals for free or at a nominal cost. As part of cooperative partnerships between hospitals and TMT, patients are treated at nominal rates in select hospitals.

Besides, TMT's donors enable the former to bear, a portion of the costs for diagnostic, procedural and medication fees. Total of 839 patients were supported at TMT towards treatment, minor surgeries, medicine, Ultra Sound, X Rays, MRI, CT Scans, Pathological test.

#### **LIFE SAVER CASES**

TMT offers the life Saver Program in collaboration with M/s Sajjadiya Trust & M/s CJMF Foundation of Canada. To date, more than 36 critical care patients in life threatening conditions have received intensive care treatments under the program.

In number of cases the patients have been facilitated to avail substantial grants from Government towards high cost life saver treatments.

#### **KEY OUTCOMES**

- \* The patients are offered financial assistance for regular treatment at TMT designated hospitals and at Era's Hospital. Support is also provided for pathological and radiological test and medication as per doctor's prescription.
- **★** Daily 250 to 300 patients attend TMT's HIZA outdoor hospital where they get consultancy and medicine at a token cost of rupees five.
- **★** Efforts have been made to seek government funding to subsidize treatment of life saver cases at SGPGI.
- ★ Total of 839 cases were covered under

medical aid program during 2020-2021

- \* All bills are paid directly to the hospitals, pharmacies or diagnostic centers, in most of the cases.
- ★ Life saver cases are also supported by the trust mainly at SGPGI and KGMU (Reputed Government hospital). On an average TMT supports around 30 such cases every year.
- ★ HIZA Hospital played an important role in eradication of tuberculosis (TB) from the surrounding area through its WHO sponsored DOT centre.
- \* Covid 19 posed a new challenge for us in year 2020-21 but due to grace of God and support of our well-wishers and medical fraternity we were able to serve the afflicted.





#### **CHALLENGES**

- ★ Limited resources and large number of needy applicants who don't have access to affordable medical services. Scope limited to Lucknow or to families of children enrolled in our free education program.
- \* Identifying and eliminating those who tend to pose as needy and try to avail benefits even though they can afford or try to seek assistance from multiple sources.
- ★ In absence of awareness and easy access to government supported free medical assistance program the cost of treatment at private hospitals is high and at times not even reliable.

★ Underprivileged families with no education end up seeking medical assistance from unqualified medical practitioners in their locality which can be fatal to their problem.

#### **AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT**

- **★** To set up more OPD clinics managed by qualified doctors.
- **★** Enhancing the capacity and services at the existing outdoor clinic HIZA.
- **★** Promote educative & preventive health care especially within underprivileged families.
- ★ Work to identify a medical insurance plan whose premium is affordable and can be supported by TMT.

#### **IMPACTS**

- 1. Mr. N Husain (Name changed) had a decent business in Lucknow and was leading a peaceful life with his wife and two children, a younger brother and a mother. He was diagnosed with esophagus cancer. The disease together with COVID Lockdown proved catastrophic and his business was battered and shut down. The patient consulted Cancer Institute in Delhi and TMT assisted him with INR 100,000/-(One Hundred Thousand) for the surgery. The treatment provided huge respite to the family. The family is afloat and apparently sailing back to normalcy.
- 2. Mr. M Husain (name changed) is a young graduate who was diagnosed with Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD). He lost his father early and his mother is employed. Managing the entire cost of treatment was quite beyond her means and the family approached TMT. Given the merit of the case, TMT participated by



- bearing a partial cost of the ongoing treatment and our contribution has reached close to rupees one hundred thousand. By the grace of God, the young man has quite recovered through medication and his high fighting spirit. He has even joined a decent job to combat the psychological trauma of disease.
- 3. Mr. N Mirza (name changed), a post graduate who recently joined a job but his sudden illness coupled with COVID lockdown led to loss of his job. Frustrated with the situation, he contacted TMT. We made arrangements for his treatment in a government hospital and by the grace of God, through the help of our well-wishers at the hospital we got the gentleman treated for his kidney stone and other infections within Rs.20,000/-. The young man is fit and with renewed vigour he is looking forward to taking up a new career assignment and shall be able to support his family well.
- 4. Ms. M. Fatima (name changed) is a 15 year old daughter of a Maulana with a big family and little resources. The girl was suffering from constant discharge from the ear for two years but lack of funds stopped the family from taking up the treatment. The family approached TMT and although the complications, overtime, had grown but by the Grace of Almighty we got the girl operated and fully treated at a cost of Rs.50,000/-. The girl is fit and the family is happy due to grace of God.

#### **GENERAL AID PROGRAMME**

#### **KEY OUTCOMES**

- ★ The areas covered are Monthly monetary assistance, food aid, housing and house repair and micro finance for small businesses.
- **★** Elderly with disabilities assisted through monthly food aid and monetary assistance to live with dignity.
- ★ Micro finance program enabled many youth and jobless to become financially independent.
- **★** INR 17 million disbursed to 7267 general aid beneficiaries.

#### **CHALLENGES**

Need is huge, resources are limited and with our priority being Education and healthcare we fail to scale up this program. We mainly keep it confined to Lucknow and those towns where we have our unity education program (UEP).

- \* Identifying and eliminating professional/ habitual beggars who tend to pose as needy and try to avail benefits from where ever possible.
- **★** To educate and change the mind set of people to take up vocations and micro businesses.

#### **AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT**

- ★ Plan has been developed to promote and scale up self-employability through vocational training, entrepreneurship training and micro financing.
- **★** Establish a separate cell headed by a professional and experienced person in this area.
- \* Enrolling needy families and individuals for government aid, support and finance programs by establishing a government designated enrolment centre under TMT supervision.

#### **SUCCESS STORIES**

- 1. Mrs. Bano is a young widow aged about 29 years. She suddenly lost her husband to an unknown illness and had no idea of the life ahead. TMT stepped in and rehabilitated the family by getting the e-rickshaw repaired and rented. We provided her monthly ration while her two young sons study in Unity College second shift. We are encouraging the widow to learn cutting and sewing skills and start her own small tailoring setup till her children get educated to take up the charge.
- 2. Mrs. S Jahan is an aged widow with an ailing son and daughter, both in mid thirties and unmarried. The third son is a zardozi worker but he hardly earns enough to sustain his life. It was beyond imagination for the family to arrange treatment for her two children. TMT consulted a top neurologist of the city who very kindly took keen interest and agreed to provide cost free consultation and medicines. We regularly arrange their checkups and get the medications delivered to the patients at their doorstep. The family is now under our monthly ration aid programme.
- 3. Mrs. Pinky about 35 years of age, illiterate widow with four orphans, two sons and two daughters. Eldest son is mentally challenged. Two daughters are studying in Unity College Second shift and youngest son is studying in a school near their house. TMT has been supporting this family since last several years which has kept the family afloat. TMT provides monthly ration, full free education to two daughters including conveyance, monthly rent of the house and occasional medical aid as per need of the family. We failed in our efforts to make Pinky employable. We firmly believe that this is a long battle and God willing the children, through education, shall gradually take up the charge of affairs of their family and would lead a respectable life.

## **EDUCATION AID PROGRAM**

#### **ABOUT**

TMT strive to maintain utmost transparency when it comes to connecting its generous donors with beneficiaries of educational aid. A through screening and verification process ensures that only genuine cases are benefitted. Moreover, since the funds are released directly to the institutions where the beneficiaries secure admission, their misuse is ruled out. The trust hopes to be able to assist more and more young people realise their dream.

- ★ Yearly disbursement of INR 19 million approximately to around 1930 beneficiaries/ students from primary to higher professional education on merit and means basis.
- \* Collaboration with professional educational institutes in Lucknow to secure concessional fee package for students sponsored by TMT.
- ★ Career counselling and guidance was made compulsory part of the educational aid

d i s b u r s e m e n t process.

- \* TMT assessment test (TAT) was introduced over and above regular evaluation process to make it more stringent and inculcate sense of competition within students at an early stage.
- ★ Students scoring well in TMT we

offered Bonus Scholarships (with additional amount) as to assist them in seeking admissions in better accredited schools.



#### **KEY OUTCOMES**

★ Meritorious students were encouraged and supported to join preparatory coaching for

#### **CHALLENGES**

- \* Most students are not ready to prepare aggressively for competitive exams to get enrolled in accredited courses. They end up studying in substandard private institutes and not so futuristic courses.
- ★ Not an encouraging result of facilitation of students to avail govt. grants/scholarships.
- \* Many students don't have a sense of responsibility towards repaying fellow students in need directly/through the trust.
- \* Resources are limited vs. need hence scaling of program cannot be achieved.
- \* Students have false notion that graduation shall earn them white collar job & don't opt for vocational courses where chances of employability & self-employability are high.

#### **AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT**

- \* Need to scale up the program both in terms of numbers and outreach to other community clusters in Uttar Pradesh.
- \* Providing regular guidance and career counseling sessions for students with an objective that they make correct career choices based on their interest, aptitude and academic merit. Pursue education from accredited institutions. Give due weightage to opting for employability driven vocational courses.
- ★ Working towards making the beneficiaries responsible towards repaying backonce settled in life.



### **IMPACT**

Ms. Zehra is the last of the three daughters who cracked NIFT with All India category Rank 25. She comes from a modest family with little resources but great focus on education.

The family's sheer determination and hard work made the fortune shine bright upon them. The second daughter is pursuing Engineering from Government Engineering College while the eldest has already completed her MBBS. The family has set an example and established without doubt that time and tide favour the ablest navigator.

The girls had little material resources at their disposal but they worked hard right from their schooling at Unity College, Lucknow and excelling became their way of life. We wish other families of the community to follow suit.
