





What a miserable place this world would have been if there was no one to sympathise with and take care of the unfortunate victims of poverty. Hazrat Ali (AS) once said "Poverty is the worst form of death".

To supplement my submission I would like to narrate an incident which with timely and adequate financial aid led to the exposition of the latent talent of an intelligent and poor boy which would have otherwise been buried under the debris of poverty.

Some four years back I came across a B. Sc. student of Shia College, Lucknow who was poor but an embodiment of sterling qualities of head and heart. His father, who had to support a family of eleven children, could hardly make both ends meet. I was simply dumb-founded to observe the pitiable condition in which this gem of a boy was prosecuting his studies undaunted even in apparently unsurmountable difficulties.

Visualising his potentialities and aptitude, as an experimental measure, I made up my mind to render financial assistance to enable him to proceed with his studies without hinderance. I accordingly approached Mr. Jafarali Asil of Bombay.

DR. KALBE SADIQ SAHAB'S MESSAGE IN FIRST TMT REPORT 1980-83

The response was very encouraging The noble and generous hearted gentleman provided the boy with sufficient money to enable him to put his heart and soul in his studies. The result was astounding. The boy not only Secured First Division but also First Position in his final examination. He was thereafter, after a competitive examination, selected for training in sugar technology in the National Sugar Institute, Kanpur. After successful train. ing of 21 years there, by the Grace of God, he is now employed as Production Chemist in the Government Sugar Factory at Nanital. May God bless Mr. Jafarali Asil whose benevolence moulded the life and future of a helpless youth.

This incident led me to realise that there could be many more boys and girls facing similar circumtances.

Encouraged by the success of my experiment I thought of, and worked out a scheme so that financial help and assistance could be rendered to poor but intelligent and promising students. This laid the foundation of "Tauheedul Muslimeen" It gradually developed through the kind attention and regular as well as casual financial assistance from the benevolent persons who not only form the nucleus but also are the perennial source of aid to the organisation.

The scheme has proved successful and quite a large number of talented but poor boys and girls, after completing their academic career, have succeeded in attaining a sound and honourable position in life. Details of such boys and girls are given in the attached Annexure.

With the aforesaid end in view, scholarships are now being sanctioned to the poor and deserving youths, with particular attention to the following qualifications and conditions :--

(a) They must be intelligent and diligent,

(b) They must be honest and religious-minded,

(c) They must be leading a disciplined life.

Religious books are also supplied to them free of cost. They will be tested off and on, to ensure that they fulfil the required qualifications as per conditions of application form. Scholarships are sanctioned on the form prescribed by the Organisation. In the event of the particulars furnished by the beneficiaries being found incorrect or in case of their failure in the tests, the scholarship will be stopped forth with.

Maulana Syed Hasan Naqvi Mujtahid, the President, and myself are constantly on tour throughout the length and breadth of the country and as such we get an opportunity of directly contacting the beneficiaries and getting first hand information about them.

Many brilliant but poor students from outside Lucknow have to face certain other obstacles. The housing problem is the toughest. Hostels are too costly and accommodation in the city being scarce, something has to be done to overcome the situation. To tide over the problem, it is considered that some of the rooms in Imambara Ghufran Ma'ab, Lucknow may be reserved for such students. It may not be out of place to mention here that this Imambara was constructed some two hundred years back by Ayatullah ul Uzma Maulana Syed Dildar Ali

Saheb, popularly known as Ghufran Ma'ab, who was the reviver of Shiaism in India. It also has a mosque attached to it. This historical and world-renowned Imambara which was the first Imambara constructed in India and contains the graves of the most pious Ulema, Mujtahids, martyrs, great scholars and poets as well as Momineen, is known as India's Vadi-us-Salam. It however suffered decay with the times. Some repairs were done by Nasirul-Millat Maulana Nasir Hussain Saheb about 70 years ago and thereafter by my late father, Maulana Syed Kalbe Hussain Saheb, in 1954, when quite a few rooms were also constructed. Unfortunately, as the result of an earthquake and torrential rains some three years back, this historical Imambara was practically razed to the ground. How-ever we are all thankful to Col. Syed Bashir Hussain Zaidi ex V. C., Muslim University, Aligarh under whose kind patronage this holy Imambara is now being reconstructed and renovated involving a huge amount. For the information of those who may be interested, it may be mentioned that while only a quarter of the reconstruction scheme has been implemented, a sum of approximately Rs. 3,00,000/- has so far been spent. The speed of the reconstruction is slow due to paucity of funds.

It has been decided that the rooms around the compound of this Imambara which are now rented to the Zardozi workers, be got vacated and reserved for such poor and promising students who do not find any accommodation elsewhere in the city. As a matter of fact two rooms have already been allotted to such students. Such a move, besides providing the students with a religious and congenial atmosphere, will also help them in attending their daily prayers and the religious discourses in the mosque attached to the Imambara.

Other Charitable activities

Dr. Ali Zaheer, M. B. B. S., a beneficiary of this Organisation is now practising in an area thickly populated by Shias. He has been advised that poor Shia patients should be given medicines from his dispensary free of cost. The cost of medicines is re-imbursed to him by this organisation. However, due to limited resources, such expenditure can be incurred only to a limited extent. This scheme can be expanded to other areas if more funds are avaiblable. Arragements have been made to open a free eye camp some time in December 83, through which eye operation services will be provided to at least 50 poor and needy eye patients free of cost. Dr. Ram Kapoor M. B. B. S. M. S. (Ophtm) has very kindly offered his free service for this camp.

Regular monthly as well as ad-hoc grants are also being given to widows, orphans, the sick and destitutes. Some monetary assistance is also given for the marriages of poor girls and for the burial of the poor and the destitutes. Such grants are simply insignificant but in this context we are following the maxim "Something is better than nothing".

There are scores of persons who though poor are so self-respecting that they will never make a request. A list of such persons is also under compilation and possible assistance will be rendered to them without any one else knowing it.

I will not hesitate to admit that we have failed in one field. Financial assistance was given to some persons for

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business also. Unfortunately not a single case turned out to be successful and the money so advanced was also blocked. May be it was due to our lack of experience and knowledge in this field. I shall be too glad and obliged to receive suggestions in this respect so that deserving and needy persons may be benefited in this sphere also.

i may also submit that the funds allotted for academic purposes are distributed throughout the country, but the major portion of the amount received for other charitable purposes has so for been utilised in Lucknow. Efforts are however afoot for the distribution of such donations to the deserving persons of other places also in greater proportion to the extent possible.

FROM SECRETARY'S DESK

Since independence our country as well as our community has advanced economically, socially and globally but still we are way behind and woefully out of pace with the international progress. We have transited through the dark period when the majority of people were indifferent towards educating their children. These days everyone desires to get his/her children educated. Numerous numbers of government and private schools have been established to cater to the growing need. However, the education one gets in these schools, specifically in rural areas, is way more different in quality aspects. Majority of these schools fail to deliver affordable quality education and as a result children attending such schools are still short of quality education which has the power to give them the knowledge, skills, and confidence to reach their full potential towards employability which in turn acts as a bulwark against poverty and exploitation.

Poor quality of education is not only limited to schools but even institutes offering professional and higher education are also lacking in quality of education and training and as a result students graduating out of such institutes don't have skills good enough to make them employable.

In this scenario it becomes more important for us to adopt measures to ensure that our children get quality and employability driven education so that with time they are not left behind in today's highly competitive world.

The need of the hour is that all stakeholders in the education sector should work on a blueprint to adopt the following measures to facilitate our students in getting employability driven quality education.

- Promote conceptl based learning by minimizing rote learning.
- Enhance numerical and English language skills of our children right from the beginner's level.
- Integrate communication skills, personality and computer literacy development programs as part of curriculum starting from primary classes onwards.
- Professional career counselling of the students from grade seven onwards so that students are able to choose their career paths based on their aptitude and interest with due clarity and confidence.
- Promote, educate and motivate students to get enrolled in vocational courses from accredited ITI's and polytechnics instead of seeking admissions in substandard colleges/ institutes and in substandard courses.
- Students with merit and aptitude are not quite confident of their capability and their potential hence they need to be counselled to prepare to pursue accredited futuristic courses from premiere institutes, universities. (Central Universities, IIM's, IISc's, NIFT, NID, NDA, IMA, TISS etc. Government medical schools and reputed Research Centers don't have a visible presence of our students.

We at TMT are trying to work and incorporate these measures in our schools and programs, though we have progressed successfully to a certain level but still we have lot more to achieve towards quality.

Its an age-old dictum that "Taaleem" (education) goes hand in hand with "Tarbiyat" (upbringing or grooming). Hence, we need to give equal importance to proper upbringing of our children along with quality education.

Our society is witnessing deterioration in the quality of upbringing and grooming (Tarbiyat) of our children. We usually attribute this serious problem to the busy life of the parents- as they tend to spend less or hardly any time with their children- and growing misuse of social media and changing family structure from joint family to nuclear family.

My personal experience which adds to the list is that parents are evading their prime responsibility by passing it on to the school and its teachers, whereas it's a joint responsibility in which parents play a major role.

Irrespective of its root causes, parents need to work seriously towards this equally important issue of much needed immaculate upbringings of our children by participating proactively to inculcate high moral, ethical, human and spiritual values in our children so that they may develop character and confidence to evolve into a good human being and socially productive and responsible citizen.

Mothers have always played a pivotal role in shaping the future of our children and leaving behind a generation which outshines their predecessor. Hence, we at TMT have also preferred to partner with mothers in all our programs. To strengthen the element of "Tarbiyat" of children we have launched a project called "Tarbiyat". The objective of the program is to educate, train and motivate mothers towards holistic upbringing of their children. Two years of Covid has pushed the program onto the back burner. We have worked out to launch a pilot project of 'Tarbiyat' again from the new session. Initially we shall be working with mothers from underprivileged families whose children are enrolled in our free education program. Team members visit homes to observe and evaluate the living condition / environment and interact with mothers on one-to-one basis as part of their need assessment exercise. Based on the need analysis they choose topics and organise orientation lectures for these mothers in manageable groups using audio-video aids.


There is no free lunch – successes are achieved by making sacrifices, determination and hard work in the right direction. Preparing a generation of higher calibre is a herculean task, especially for mothers who never got an opportunity to attend schools. But I have a strong conviction that the investment we put jointly into our children and sacrifices we make today by providing "Taaleem with Tarbiyat" will help them to achieve greater heights and create a brighter future irrespective of their socio-economic status.

Before I conclude, I, also, wish to use this opportunity to convey my gratitude to all our well wishers, supporters, donors and team members for taking TMT and its projects from one level to another. Whatever has been accomplished is due to grace of The All Merciful and support of our stakeholders but still, we have miles to go, and considerable qualitative and quantitative scaling needs to be achieved by TMT team towards empowering the underprivileged by providing them means for quality education, healthcare and general wellbeing.

HEAD WISE INCOME





CHARITY EDUCATION MEDICAL PROJECT UNITY EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM






NUMBER OF BENEFICIARIES ASSISTED

CHALLENGES

- The academic session 2021-22 was full of new challenges for the teachers ,students and administration of Unity College. Making a shift from traditional to online teaching was a major challenge to the educators as the suddenness with which they were plunged into this new mode of teaching meant that they went into it with little preparation and then going back to the physical/hybrid mode from the virtual was again a challenge for the students and teachers .
- This unusual situation was tackled with unmatched dedication, commitment and dexterity.
- Limited availability of resources like Smartphones and laptops with students, as well as teachers, was a great challenge in meeting our objectives.
- Re-aligning the system and infrastructure in sync with the demands of on-line teaching was again an area of concern.
- Due to the general financial crisis, parents couldn't deposit the fee.
- The session closed with a huge deficit.

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UNITY COLLEGE-SECOND SHIFT

Unity College-2 nd shift was established in 1999 under the banner of Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust- a nonprofit organization established by Dr. S. Kalbe Sadiq for the educational, social and material upliftment of the under privileged community.

With a humble beginning and with just 17 students in 1999, it has now bloomed into a full-fledged school with 1,500 students who receive free education as part of Unity College Second Shift. We aim to provide equal educational opportunities to children irrespective of their financial backgrounds.

Classes for Nursery all through to Intermediate (Class 12th) are held between 2-

6 pm on weekdays with students having complete access to the entire academic and activity infrastructure available to their Unity College morning shift counterparts. Initially a Hindi Medium School the class are being gradually converted to English medium and till 2022 classes up till X have been successfully converted to English medium to cater to the demands of the globalized and competitive market Unity College-2nd shift is committed to achieving academic excellence. The college imparts education to children from Lower Nursery to Class XII. The College offers Humanities and Commerce stream in Intermediate. The College imparts the knowledge of Maths, Science, Computer Science, G.K., Theology, Art & Craft, English, Hindi and Social Studies.

The institution maintains a judicious blend of academic and co-curricular activities to provide an apt platform for students to display, their innate skills. With this aim in mind various activities like debates, quiz, orientation, competitions, creative writing, drawing and storytelling competitions are organized throughout the year to bring out the best in every child. For the same purpose various sports events like Inter House Badminton, Cricket, Basketball and Kho-Kho matches are also organized.



HIGHLIGHTS

- 100% pass result in Class X and XII.
- Pre-primary and primary sections adopted English as medium of instruction.
- Teaching taking place as per Montessori system in Pre Primary section of the school
- Student-centered teaching (SCT) adopted in primary section.
- Career counseling sessions by experts for Class X and XII students.
- Online Psychometric Personality Test was also conducted for them.
- Training of teachers by M/S. ASEEMA Mumbai on conducting effective online teaching.

Pilot study for Wadhwani Foundation-

Skilling course- 21 students participated in this pilot study. This commenced in the month of January and ended in February 2022. Four collaborate sessions were held 17 students completed the course successfully.

Several Class XII graduates secure admission in prestigious institutions like Avadh Girls Degree College, Isabella Thoborn College and Lucknow University.

While some male students are pursuing engineering, fine arts, animation and multimedia. Majority of the students from the school readily get employed after completion of their under graduate program or vocational training diploma.

KEY OUTCOMES


- Montessori teaching method adopted at Pre-Primary level to compensate for the lack of a conducive learning environment at students homes.

Our aim is to serve the society by making them educated, cultured, employable and self-dependent.



Hazrat Imam Zainul Abideen A.S. (HIZA) Charitable Hospital, set up in 1991, runs as a joint project of Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust and Al- Imaan Charitable Trust Mumbai.

The Hospital provides medicines at nominal rates to those below the poverty line without any discrimination on the basis of caste, creed or religion. Services rendered by HIZA hospital are dictated by our concern for providing healthcare to the marginalized section of society.

HIZA operates exclusively in marginalized area which lack access to affordable and quality healthcare services. All Its services - extremely beneficial for local residents- are free for widows, destitute, and orphans while other needy have to pay a nominal fee of Rs 6 towards consultation by a qualified doctor and medicines for one day. On an average 300 patients attend the OPD daily.

There are Six MBBS, doctors, four BUMS doctors, One experienced Physiotherapist, two Optometrist and one BDS doctor. The set-up is supervised by Chief Medical Supdt. a Surgeon having experience of about 45 years.

HIZA (A.S.) CHARITABLE HOSPITAL



HIGHLIGHTS

- Extension of Hospital building has completed in 2021-2022 With the support of Al-Imaan Charitable Trust, Mumbai
- Various medical units have been constructed e.g. full fledged Dental Unit, a big general ward, Minor OT Room, Conference Room, three rooms for optho-operation, a small canteen. A six seater Automatic Elevator has been provided.

- Computers have been installed on every counters and all works are done on them.

Under Mother and Child Care programme, pregnant poor ladies were provided free medicines, pathology check up and nutritious food.

 Free medical camps were organized during 2 month and 8 days Moharram period on various Imambargahs on

different dates.

- Immunizations and Pulse Polio Programme is also done on Sundays in the Hospital.
- For T.B. elimination a NGO by the name of & Joint Effort for Elimination of Tuberculosis (JEET) worked with HIZA facilitating patients for examination of biological specimen for TB and providing Rs. 500/- to T.B. patients during the course of treatment.
- Regular campaigns were organised for creating medical awareness among the people so as to ensure their good health and well being.
- In this regard patients attending the hospital are educated about personal hygiene, general sanitation, environmental up keep and hazards of smoking and pan masala chewing in particular & other STD, AIDS and communicable diseases, in general.





RENOVATION & CONSTRUCTION OF NEW FACILITIES

With the generous support of Al Imaan Charitable Trust Mumbai, a whole new floor has been added to the existing building of Hazrat Imam Zainul Abideen (AS) Charitable Hospital.

The hospital now has a more covered area on the ground and the floor as well. With this additional space the hospital is now operating two pharmacies, a full-fledged dental section with the latest chair and necessary gadgets.

The Ophthalmology Section has also received more space with an advance examination / testing machine. Physiotherapy unit has been shifted in a whole new section with new machines for physiotherapy.

The hospital now has a conference room and a dedicated ward to admit patients. Subsequent to the awaited approval from the state Government, the hospital shall be able to start IPD facilities as well. The hospital now has a 63.5 KVA Silent DG Set to provide backup for the complete electrical requirements of the hospital.



Way Forward

- Establishing In-Patient facilities with at least 20 beds in the hospital.
- Registration of HIZA hospital with Health Insurance Agencies and with CMO Lucknow, so that ≫ Govt., semi-govt. and private sectors, employees may get mediclaim payments.
- Installation of Digital X-Ray Machine for all types of X-Rays and an Ultra-Sound Machine.



An official report has estimated that an enormous number, say more than 6 crore people slide into poverty every year due to excessive and unexpected expenditure over healthcare which neutralizes the gains of rising income and various government schemes aimed to reduce poverty.

TMT's Medical Aid Program aims at tackling this serous issue of healthcare access and affordability. It offers medical aid to those below the poverty line through a network of hospitals for free or at a nominal cost. As part of cooperative partnerships between hospitals and TMT, patients are treated at nominal rates in select hospitals. In addition, TMT's donors enable the former to bear a share of the costs for diagnostic, procedural and medication fees. Total of 925 patients were supported at TMT towards treatment, minor surgeries, medicine, Ultra Sound, X Rays, MRI, CT Scans, and host of other Pathological tests.

LIFE SAVER CASES

In collaboration with M/s Sajjadiya Trust, M/s CJMF Foundation of Canada & amp; M/s The Mainstay Foundation, UK, TMT offers life Saver Program. To date, more than 47 critical care patients in life-threatening conditions have received intensive care treatments under this program.

In a number of cases the patients have been facilitated to avail substantial grants from Government towards the high cost of life saver treatments.

KEY OUTCOMES

Patients are offered financial assistance for regular treatment at TMT's designated hospitals and at ERA'S University's Hospital. Support is also provided for pathological, diagnostic tests and medication as per doctor's prescription.

On a daily basis about 250 to 300 patients attend TMT's HIZA outdoor hospital where they get consultancy and medicine at a token _cost of rupees ten.

Efforts are always made to seek government funding to subsidize treatment of life saver cases at SGPGI and King George Medical College, Lucknow.

Total of 972 cases were covered under medical aid program during 2021-2022

All bills are paid directly to the hospitals, pharmacies and diagnostic centers.

Life saver cases are also supported by the trust mainly at SGPGI and KGMU (Reputed

Government hospitals). On an average, TMT supports around 30 such cases every year.

HIZA (AS) Charitable Hospital played an important role in eradication of tuberculosis (TB) from the surrounding area through its WHO sponsored DOT centre.

CHALLENGES

- Identifying and eliminating those who tend to pose as needy and try to avail benefits even though they can afford or try to seek assistance from multiple sources.
- Limited resources and large number of needy applicants who don't have

IMPACT

Mr. Syed Hasan, of Lucknow, aged about 36 years was suffering from severe cardiac issues and doctor advised him open heart surgery which brought the unsuspecting family into great distress. Mr Hasan, a zari worker, was the sole earner for his wife and 3 daughters. The illness rendered him out of work and made it difficult even to arrange two square meals a day. His two daughters are studying in class 6th and 4th in Unity Mission School while the youngest daughter of 4 years is still to get admitted in school. The family, completely bewildered, approached us. We, at TMT, arranged monthly ration for family till Mr. Hasan gets well and joins work. We got him admitted in ERA and under special package his open heart surgery was conducted at ERA'S Medical College, Lucknow under complete TMT sponsorship at a cost of Rs.1,60,000/-. Mr. Hasan is stable and now he is taking care of his family, without anyone's support.

Ms. Syeda Zia, of Lucknow, aged about 35 years, suffered from Triple-negative breast cancer. Her husband has a small shop whose income was just sufficient to look after the sustenance of the family and education of three daughters. The eldest daughter is in class 7th the second in class 5th while the younger is 6 years old and delayed for school due to financial reasons. The husband approached us after failing in his best attempts to arrange resources for the treatment. The family was quite discouraged as post Covid scenario was fairly gloomy and presented little hope. We found the family genuine and in dire need of financial support to immediately combat the disease lest it may turn fatal. Substantial help was immediately extended to get the lady treated at Lucknow Cancer Institute, a reputed specialty center for Cancer. The treatment was effective and she completely recovered. She is now living a normal and happy life with her family.



To improve upon the mother and child health from pregnancy till the first birthday of the child TMT has initiated a Mother and Child Care Project (MCCP) for 50 deserving mothers with an objective to improve upon their overall health and wellbeing on standard medical parameters.

We identify expecting women belonging to underprivileged families in their initial stage of pregnancy enrolled in: HIZA outdoor Clinic managed by TMT in Lucknow, ERA hospital Lucknow, UEP (free education Program) families and others visiting TMT.

Procedure:

Underprivileged and undernourished mothers

with dietary deficiencies are identified in consultation with professional gynaecologists.

Team:

Our team at TMT seek professional help of gynaecologists, paediatricians, dieticians and counsellors

We make available:

Prenatal and postnatal care under supervision of specialists.

Medication-supplements-balanced healthy diet,

Counselling (Importance of breastfeeding– Health and hygiene-child care– Psychological) Vaccinations.

The endeavor is supported by M/s The Mainstay Foundation, UK.

IMPACT

Naseema* got married 5 years back in a joint family set up in Dargah locality of Lucknow. Naseema's marital household consists of- a mother in law, sister in law, brother in law and his wife and her own husband. Naseema has a slight limp in her leg that has always made her conscious about her physical appearance and often stopped her to go out in social gatherings as she always feels a sense of otherness settling in her an embarrassment about her disability. Ever since her marriage, Naseema and her husband wanted a child. In the last five years, the couple experienced several miscarriages just before entering the second trimester. This further drained the mental capacity of Naseema. This time, TMT found Naseema in her second trimester and worked closely with her so that she is able to deliver a healthy baby. Home visits were conducted by female staff members so that the beneficiary gets a sense of comfort and trust. The entire family system was involved

and counselled. Spiritual counselling also played vital role and we managed to minimize the haunts of traumas from the past and also

helped in creation of favourable atmosphere. An essential support system was found in the mother in law who helped Naseema battle the odds she was facing.

Naseema was furnished with nutritional boost packets so that her body is able to better sustain her pregnancy. This was done in consultation with a certified nutritionist and doctor. The joint efforts of TMT and the family system resulted in Naseema delivering a healthy baby boy. The organisation is still connected with Naseema for her bi-monthly check ups and supply of nutritional packets that is tailored for the bodily needs of a lactating mother.

GENERAL AID PROGRAM

KEY OUTCOMES

We cover Monthly Monetary Assistance, House Repair and Micro Finance for Small Businesses.

Elderly people with disabilities / disadvantages are assisted through Monthly Food Aid /Monetary Assistance to help them live with dignity.

Micro finance program enabled many youth and jobless to become financially independent.

To mitigate the catastrophic effect of COVID-19, TMT extended aid of INR 14 million to around 6000 beneficiaries.

CHALLENGES

1. Need is huge, resources are limited and with our priority being Education and healthcare we fail to scale up this program. We mainly keep it confined to Lucknow and those towns where we have our unity education program (UEP).

2. Identifying and eliminating professional / habitual beggars who tend to pose as needy and try to avail benefits from everywhere possible.

3. To educate and change the mind set of people to take up vocations and micro businesses.

WAY FORWARD

- Plan has been developed to promote and scale up self-employability through vocational training, entrepreneurship training and micro financing.
- To establish a separate cell headed by a professionally experienced person.
- Enrolling needy families and individuals for government funded aid, support, finance programs by establishing a government designated enrolment centre under TMT management.

IMPACT

Mrs. Bashrat along with her ailing husband and 7 children lives in a rented accommodation in Old Lucknow. The family was in shambles with no hope in sight when the lady visited TMT for assistance. The TMT immediately stepped in extending multidimensional help to the family. The ailing husband was provided prompt medical attention to save life but the gentleman is still not capable of working to earn for family. The children were enrolled in schools but unfortunately only two daughters are continuing while others dropped off. Eldest son is 14 and he, with TMT's financial support, has put up a small roadside shop to earn sustenance for the family. The boy is young and earning is not sufficient for a family of nine members thus TMT is regularly providing monthly ration to the family to keep them afloat. We are constantly working with the family to again and again enroll the children in the school so that they may become future engines for the family.

Mrs. Rubi lost her husband and finding no support with the in-laws returned back to Lucknow to her mother. The situation here was not rosy as the family is not capable of supporting the widow with three children. The lady was referred to TMT and we comprehensively worked to rehabilitate the widow and her children. The lady had medical issues for which she was sent to Era and surgery was conducted at the expense of TMT. The two daughters and a son were admitted to a nearby school and scholarship was extended. After she recovered, she was provided six months of training in a professional Institute for sewing and stitching. All this time the family was provided a monthly ration for sustenance. She is now in a position to stand on her feet and take care of her basic family responsibilities. Note: Names have been changed to protect the identity and privacy of individuals.



THE FOOD AID PROJECT

The Food Aid Project provides underprivileged families with uncooked food ingredients. We deliver Food Packets to the deserving families during the holy month of Ramzan.

This year, we reached out to 5281 families with a total budget of INR 11 Million. TMT team tried to cover the underprivileged families from within the community and non community as well.

We did not limit ourselves to Lucknow only rather we distributed food bags in other cities of Uttar Pradesh. The bag was good to last for a month for a family of five members.

CHALLENGES

With our previous years' experience, we were successful in mitigating the challenges.

1. The price volatilities were very high and

- supplies were highly erratic amid Russia –Ukraine war uncertainties, probabilities of on setting of fourth wave of COVD and elections in our State of Uttar Pradesh.
- 2. Multiple vendors were contacted and among them three were finalized with slight variation in their rates for the same commodities and quantities.
- 3. Duplication, as usual, posed a challenge but not a major one as there were very few food hampers were distributed by some individuals / organisations.
- 4. Though we have combed the pockets for deserving families but we still fear that reaching out to a few left over families is still a problem. They are suffering silently and are not aggressive enough to avail food stuff that is being distributed.



EDUCATION AID PROGRAM

TMT strives to maintain transparency when it comes to connecting its generous donors with beneficiaries of educational aid. A through screening and verification process ensures that only genuine cases are benefitted. Moreover, since the funds are released directly to the institutions where the beneficiaries secure admission, their misuse is ruled out. The Trust aspires to be able to assist more and more young people realize their dream.

KEY OUTCOMES

Meritorious students were encouraged and supported to join preparatory coaching for competitive exams for medical, engineering, law, fashion designing and banking.

Yearly disbursement of INR 19 million approximately to around 1930 beneficiaries/students from primary to higher professional education on merit and means basis. Collaboration with professional educational institutes in Lucknow to secure concessional fee package for students sponsored by TMT.

Career counseling and guidance was made compulsory part of the educational aid disbursement process.

TMT assessment test (TAT) was introduced over and above regular evaluation process to make it more stringent and inculcate sense of competition within students at an early stage.

Students scoring well in TMT we offered Bonus Scholarships (with additional amount) as to assist them in seeking admissions in better accredited schools.

CHALLENGES

Most students are not ready to prepare aggressively for competitive exams to get enrolled in accredited courses. They end up enrolling in substandard private institutes with not so futuristic courses.



Not an encouraging result of facilitation of students to avail govt. grants/ scholarships. Many students dont have a sense of responsibility towards repaying for fellow students in need either directly or through the Trust. difficult to achieve.

Students have false notion that graduation shall earn them white collar job & dont opt forvocational courses where chances of employability & entrepreneurship are high.

Resources are limited while need seems unlimited – hence scaling of program is

- >> Need to scale up the program both in terms of numbers and outreach to other community clusters in Uttar Pradesh.
- Providing regular guidance and career counselling sessions for students with an objective that they make correct career choices based on their interest, aptitude and academic merit. Pursue education from accredited institutions. Give due weightage to opting for employability driven vocational courses.





TMT is strongly standing with her and catering to all her financial needs for her MBBS studies.
