

# The Origin



rom merely an idea in the mind of an individual, to an institution that is today well-known in the field of education and healthcare, Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust's journey is one that inspires hope.

On a seemingly ordinary evening in the late 1970s, Dr S Kalbe Sadiq was at a relative's house in Old Lucknow when a man walked in and said he had something to show. He took Dr Sadiq to a dilapidated house where a young boy sat on a rickety cot, deeply engrossed in study under the light of an oil

lamp. "He's my son," the man said. "He is keen to study and is extremely hardworking. However, I do not have the means to fulfil his wish." Dr Sadiq interacted with the boy and was impressed with his intellect and dedication. He was convinced that the boy would do well academically if given a chance to study, and would also be able to bring his family out of poverty.

Dr Sadiq wrote to a Mumbai-based acquaintance, Late Mr. Jafar Ali Aseel, asking him if he could support the boy's education

financially. Mr Aseel responded by sending over funds to cover expenses for the boy's two years of education. The beneficiary went on to complete his graduation with very good marks.

While Dr Sadiq was happy over the boy's changed fortune, he felt for the thousands of other children who were willing to study but were bound by their families' limited means. He continued to identify such needy and deserving children, asking friends and acquaintances to sponsor their studies. Soon, however, he realised that for large-scale impact, there was need to take up the mission in a more structured manner. In 1984, professionals in the field of education were brought together and Tauheedul



Muslimeen Trust (TMT) was formed. The name was inspired by the need for education as well as unity among the Muslims to rid the community of widespread ignorance and poverty.



The beginnings were humble. The first institution to come up under TMT was Unity College, which started in 1988 in a small, rented room with the most basic infrastructure and a handful of students. The fact that it was professionally run and driven by genuine concern for the disadvantaged attracted several supporters to the venture. Using the same premises, the Unity College Evening Shift started a decade later with nine students to provide underprivileged, deserving children free education. Today, both the institutions together have over 3400 students enrolled for academic pursuits on a state-of-the-art campus.

Several educational and medical institutions as well as charity programmes are either run or supported by the Trust. TMT is grateful to its generous donors who have supported it throughout the journey and facilitated the transition of a dream to reality.

ost of the major religions of the world originated as movements for justice, moral awakening and righteous living. They were meant to bring order in place of chaos and envisioned societies that were principled, peaceful, equitable, and free of exploitation. If one takes the example of Arab society before Prophet Muhammad (PBUH), it is undeniable that Islam has been, to a great extent, successful in bringing about a phenomenal positive change among its followers.

Over the time, however, monarchs and so-called religious preachers came to dominate their respective religion, and Islam was no exception. This monopolisation of faith resulted in unnecessary and debilitating stress on rituals, turning the practice of religion soulless and incapable of guiding one towards the light of truth. The Prophet seems to have predicted this in one of hadith where he states that a time will come when mosques will be adorned with beautiful chandeliers and expensive stones but will be frequented only by people of bad repute.

Hazrat Ali (AS) too has given numerous

instances of people who never missed their prayers, fasted and were particular about other Islamic obligations, but merely as empty rituals. These actions alone will not help us on the Day of Judgment. Unless we strive against exploitation, oppression and wrongdoing, we are not true Muslims.

I once attended an exhibition in Toronto, Canada, titled 'Sultan of Sciences', which showcased inventions of Muslims that were later appropriated by their counterparts from the West. While it documented our glorious past wherein innovation and exploration were celebrated, the exhibition, in itself, was a sad commentary on the community's gradual descent into ignorance. I came to the conclusion that, as long as Islamic scholars were discussing science and technology, we were progressing. Over time, however, these were replaced by discussions on rituals which widened sectarian differences

and distracted Muslims from the mission of Islam.

The only virtue that sets one apart is the attainment of knowledge, irrespective of the segment a person belongs to. If a man or a woman has integrity, education, uprightness, he/she would enjoy a higher stature in their society regardless of religion. While ignorance is a cause of humiliation, acquisition of knowledge enhances our cognitive ability and equips us to make better insights while understanding something.

There's no denying the fact that Ulema and scholars were learned and knowledgeable, but even they misinterpreted certain verses of the Holy Quran regarding renunciation of material wealth and taking pride in voluntary poverty. They asserted that Islam and poverty were inseparable, glorifying poverty to an extent that it was seen as a virtue. However, while Islam does encourage an immaterial lifestyle, it in no way suggests that we consider it as a blessing from Allah. In fact, Muslims have only themselves to blame for their

deplorable economic state and must make amends to extricate poverty through education.

The Holy Quran says that all languages are Allah's gift to mankind. Islam has always laid emphasis on the attainment of knowledge and there are several instances in the Holy Quran that corroborate this statement.

There's also a dire need to broaden our horizon and bring about a reform in the education system in order to make advancements. Our Ulema committed a grave mistake by shunning the English language when it became the official language of the country during the British rule in India. They misinterpreted certain verses of the Holy Quran and termed English as the language of atheists, warning that western culture would influence youth in a negative way. To this day, Muslims are suffering the consequences of this fallacy and are lagging behind in many spheres. Contrary to their belief, the Holy Quran says that all languages are Allah's gift to mankind. Islam has always laid emphasis on the attainment of knowledge and there are several instances in the Holy Quran that corroborate this statement.

I have gone through a hadith which illustrated Prophet Mohammad's (pbhu) inclination towards education and advancement. Once he entered Masjid e Nabawi and witnessed two groups - one was praying while the other was discussing an academic problem. He admired both the groups but preferred to join the one where the academic problem was being discussed, saying that Allah (swt) has sent me primarily for educating people. In those days, mosques were deemed as places of study, where subjects like astronomy and geography were taught by none other than our own Imams.

Today, however, not giving priority to education is a serious blunder committed by Muslims which has led them to their miserable plight. We should understand our responsibility and work towards preventing the community from being in a state of ignorance and indulging in unwarranted rituals.

At TMT, we have launched a scheme under which we send our team in villages and city outskirts to identify children who have calibre and are willing to study, but their parents find it difficult to arrange necessary funds. We bear all their expenses and get them enrolled in a good school in their vicinity. By the grace of Allah (swt) and the hard work put

in by our team, there's a marked difference in the environment of these children and their families. We are striving hard to expose them to the realities of life, enrich their experience, and most importantly put an end to unwarranted factional tussles that are outcome of ignorance.

We should understand our responsibility and work towards preventing the community from being in a state of ignorance and indulging in unwarranted rituals.

The situation is grave but certainly redeemable. The current pitiable state of Muslims can improve if we pay attention to the upbringing and education of our children. If we are passionate about something, we are more determined to find a way to set it in motion. And as long as we are determined, success will always be attainable.

And, certainly, Allah (swt) is the best of helpers.

nity College was established in 1988 under the banner of Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust (TMT) by Dr S Kalbe Sadiq. TMT had till then facilitated scholarships for deserving children. Now, a dedicated educational institution opened up wider possibilities to serve the society and offered greater scope for quality control. Initially operating out of a single room setup, Unity College today is

spread over a sprawling 5.75 acre, landscaped campus. Affiliated to CICSE Board, the college imparts modern, value-based education from lower nursery to Class XII. The College offers courses in Humanities, Commerce and Science to the students appearing for ISC. The campus buzzes with a plethora of activities throughout the year to bring about holistic development among children and also to

inculcate in them a sense of responsible citizenship, committed to the values of peace, compassion and co-existence. The college encourages every student to find his/her calling based on aptitude. Regular teachers' training ensures that the pedagogy is always up-to-date with global standards.

Various activities like debates, quiz, elocution, creative writing and drawing and story-telling competitions are organized throughout the year to bring out the best in every child. Students also participate actively in intra-school and inter-school sporting events, and many have gone on to play at professional platforms. A new block, whose construction began last year, is now fully functional. Built over more than 9,000 sq ft, the project cost 11 million rupees.



n 1999, Unity College Second Shift started as a free quality education programme with just nine students. As the name suggests, the school is run in the second shift in the existing infrastructure of Unity College to give children from underprivileged backgrounds equal opportunity in pursuit of excellence. Today, around 1400 students are enrolled in this evening school from Nursery to Class XII.

As in Unity College, the students have access to smart classrooms, a well-stocked library, computer lab, I-Cat room, science labs and a large playground. Till class II, there are no exams. For overall development of the students, several co-curricular activities like debate, extempore, creative writing, GK, quiz, essay writing, drawing competition, recitation competition, mathematics quiz, story-telling competition are conducted

along with inter-house sports events. Apart from complete fee waiver, the students are provided transport and medical facilities as well as uniforms, books, stationery and other essentials. In the Board examination this year, the school not only witnessed 100% pass percentage, but also saw all students of class X and XII securing 1st division marks.

## THE BIG TRANSITION

Montessori method: The well-known Montessori method of teaching will be implemented completely in Unity College second shift from the 2016-17 session. Prior to this, the college ventured to adopt English as medium of instruction year-by-year, moving to higher classes. This year, the conversion reached class V.

Widening horizons: In a pleasant departure from tradition, two graduates of Unity College second shift—Arbiya Salmani and Safeena Rizvi— secured admission in Awadh Girls' Degree College in 2015. This is not only an indication of quality education being imparted in the college but also the ascending graph of merit in the boards.

Empowerment through skills

Lucknow

t is skill, not strength, that governs a ship," goes an old saying. A society once fixated with white collar jobs, India is slowly realising the value and potential of skill-based learning. The demand for skilled workers has grown tremendously in modern India, and in early realisation of the same, Unity Private Industrial Training Institute (UPITI) came into being in 1995. The endeavor is supported by Mr Shokat Alibhai and Mr Mustafa Kassam. The centre initially operated with a few enrolments in

a small shed on Unity College campus. Today, 248 full-time students are trained in 7 trades affiliated to National Council for Vocational Training (NCVT). This was made possible by an extension of infrastructure to an overall 11,000 sqft of covered area comprising 30 rooms. About 344 students are enrolled in short-term courses with high job value. UPITI has also collaborated with CADD Centre, a leading AutoCAD Institute for training Draughtsman Civil students.



A daily wage carpenter earning no more than Rs 200 a day, Mr Kamal Mehdi of Barabanki has three children—two sons and a daughter. In 2010-11, the UEP team surveyed the family and ascertained that the condition of their house and financial status necessitated external support. UEP sponsored the education of Mr Mehdi's two sons—Minhal Haider (Class V) and Bilal Mehdi (Class IV), who are studying in Mohd Sibtain Memorial School, Barabanki, from 2010 and 2011 onwards respectively. Minhal Haider scored well in UEP's Quality Control Test and was subsequently selected for MU College, Aligarh for the session 2016-17.

around Rs 7,500 per month. His elder brother bears the educational expenses of two of his three sons who are studying in class II and kindergarten. In 2010-11, the UEP team surveyed the family and discovered that after accounting for rent and other household expenses, the family was barely left with anything to support the third child's education. Under the UEP sponsorship program, Meezan Rizvi, aged 4, was inducted in Safa College, Aligarh. He was selected for Minto Circle (AMU) in class III in the session 2015-16.



Bridging the gap

t the heart of Unity Education Programme (UEP) lies the belief that for any promising child willing to study, financial means should not be constraint. Under the programme, deserving children are selected in rural and urban areas and provided cost-free quality education, which includes school fee, uniforms, shoes & socks, stationery and transport facility. At present, approximately 1,520 students receive

education in 24 recognized English-medium schools in 8 different cities of Uttar Pradesh. Chhattisgarh and West Bengal.

When the programme was started in 2004, it was discovered that most children sponsored were first-generation learners. With the parents not only unlettered but also reluctant towards sending their wards to school, UEP's journey has been tough but extremely fruitful. In the 2015-16 session, once dismal

attendance in school rose up to 85% among UEP sponsored students, translating in better grades.

The UEP does not depend solely on home exams conducted within schools. To evaluate the academic performance of the students. the UEP Cell annually conducts a Quality Control test (QCT) to evaluate the students mainly in English, Math, Science and General Knowledge. The 2015-16 session witnessed marked improvement with average QCT aggregate marks recorded at 47%".

Regular workshops are conducted for teachers as well as students to align the programme according to their needs

Recognizing the importance of paying special attention to students who are academically not very bright. UEP facilitates extra coaching classes wherever necessary.

At present, these classes are being run in Allahabad. 10 children (12-15yrs) with special needs have also been enrolled in 'Chetna', a voluntary organization which provides education and therapeutic services to such children.

UEP also has a reward policy wherein students who perform well in the QCT or have 100% attendance are rewarded. In May 2015, a resurvey was started not just in all the schools connected with UEP but among students receiving sponsorship under UEP. This helps maintain quality standards in schools and ensure that the most deserving receive financial assistance.

In the 2015-16 session, 19 students were selected in MU College, Aligarh, 2 in Aligarh Muslim University, and five in Unity College.





# **UNITY COLLEGE, ALLAHABAD**Going the extra mile

nity Public School began operating from a modest rented building in 1993 in the densely populated area of Kareli, Allahabad. Established under the management of Imamiya Education Society, headed by Dr Rizwan Haider, the school has, over the years, grown into a full-fledged English medium intermediate college affiliated to ICSE New Delhi. The college houses 32 classrooms, physics, chemistry, biology and

computer labs, library, snack bar and a play area built over 12,300 sq ft of land. For all-round development of the students, Unity College, Allahabad conducts various interhouse and inter-school competitions.

Co-curricular activities like calligraphy, recitations, art competitions, bulletin board decorations are regularly organized to hone the artistic capabilities of young minds. The college has now expanded to accommodate

the educational needs of more than 2,200 students.

This year, as in last, the school witnessed nearly 100% pass percentage in Board examinations. Huzaifa Khan (Commerce) and Alisha Hashmi (Commerce) made the school proud by securing 92% and 93.6% marks in ISC and ICSE respectively.

To cater to the needs of children coming from villages and having little or no education, Unity Intermediate College, Saidpur was established on the sparsely populated outskirts of Allahabad. There are around 500 students enrolled. The college is affiliated to UP Board and follows Hindi medium pattern. It spreads over 12 bighas of land.

In 1992, Tauheedul Muslimeen Trust took over Hazrat Imam Zainul Abideen (HIZA) charitable hospital, which had till then been managed by Mumbai's 'Ahlulbayt Foundation'. With illustrious patrons like Moulana Sayed Mohd Al-Moosavi and Dr S Kalbe Sadig at the helm, HIZA Hospital has grown by leaps and bounds over the years and today serves close to 400 people on a daily basis. For many in the nearby

community, HIZA is the place to go to for medical care, because the hospital provides a wide range of health services at a nominal cost. In fact, a large chunk of the patients come from the below poverty line (BPL) segment. Orphans, destitute and widows are provided medicines free-of-cost. The hospital also hosts routine immunisation programs as well as awareness campaigns on healthy living and disease prevention.

#### TACKLING TUBERCULOSIS

HIZA's DOTS Centre, a unit of WHO supported by Government TB Hospital, intervened when incidence of tuberculosis had reached epidemic proportions in the area BM it serves. Free sputum examination and distribution of anti-tuberculosis drugs helped to nearly eradicate the ailment from the area. This year, only 13 TB cases were reported at the centre, and all were fully cured.

# General Aid Program



MT continues to provide assistance to those finding it difficult to make ends meet. Several thousand people have received financial aid, Ramzan food hampers, winter blankets and funds for essential home repairs from TMT. In addition, the institution provides regular monthly ration and medical aid to families who have lost their

breadwinners or are struggling even to put food on the table. This is in line with our philosophy of rendering relief to the distressed and our vision of a more equitable world. TMT is hopeful of providing generous support to more such cases in the future and work towards furthering the cause of humanity and betterment of the society.

# A friend in times of crisis

Mrs. Nazia is the young widow of Ali Bahadur, a zari worker who died in October 2015 after a long battle with TB. The couple's has two children— Mahak, 7, and Faizan Ali, 6, are enrolled in class I and KG respectively in Unity mission School. Nazia is a zari worker who occasionally works as a domestic servant for sustenance. She lives in her mother's house as the in-laws shoved out the family after her husband's death. TMT assists the family with regular monthly ration aid.

Mr Hasan, aged about 40, has been polio-afflicted since birth and earns around Rs 3,000 per month as a zari worker. His family comprises his ailing mother, wife and two children. Due to slowdown in embroidery work, the family struggled to manage two square meals a day. Mr Hasan's daughter Amina Zehra, 3, was suffering from a stomach disorder was treated under TMT's medical aid programme. His 4-year-old son Wafa Abbas's studies at a play group are sponsored by TMT. The family received Ramzan food hampers & blankets in winter and is enrolled for monthly ration aid from TMT.

Old Lucknow resident Mr Chand Miyan, 48, found himself unable to carry on with his zardozi work after developing a rare stomach ailment. His younger son, who was studying in Unity College Second Shift, too was diagnosed with intestinal TB and died despite best medical efforts sponsored by TMT. His wife and other two children continue to receive medical and educational assistance from TMT. While the elder son has joined UITC's air condition & refrigeration course, the younger daughter's studies have been sponsored by TMT. The family received regular ration and blankets from TMT in winter. The cost of essential house repairs was borne by the Trust.

When Mr Athar Raza, a heart and sugar patient, died in 2014, he left behind 4 children. While one of his two sons works as a salesperson at a mobile store, earning Rs 4,000 per month, his daughter Nafees Jahan studied in Unity Mission school & subsequently completed BCom from Shia PG College, all her educational expenses borne by the Trust. TMT also contributed some amount in her marriage held in March 2016. His youngest daughter Gulshan is appearing in Class 10 exam this year from UMS. The family receives regular ramzan ration aid & blankets from TMT.



# Micro-Assistance Program

"Give a man a fish, and you feed him for a day. Teach a man to fish, and you feed him for a lifetime" goes an old Chinese proverb. To encourage self-sustenance and gainful employment, TMT supports deserving individuals by way of micro-finance.

Some beneficiaries from this year include:

- Mrs Rafat Sahiba, who received Rs 50,000 from TMT for stitching work & readymade cloth business.
- Mr Zayar Husain, who received Rs 15000 for livestock purchase.
- Mr Raza, an LIC agent who needs to travel frequently, was assisted with Rs 30,000 for partial payment of a motorcycle to boost his mobility.
- Mr Zahid Zaidi, a resident of Old Lucknow, received Rs 15,000 for setting up a grocery store.
- Ms Azmat Jahan, Salma Fatima & Nazma Bano were provided branded sewing machines.
- TMT has extended marriage aid to around 35 girls. In some of these cases, the beneficiary was an alumna of Unity Mission School .

# Medical Aid Program

here is growing evidence of households being pushed into poverty or forced into deeper poverty when faced with substantial medical expenses, particularly when combined with a loss of household income due to ill-health.

With public sector spending on healthcare constantly on the decline, quality healthcare remains unaffordable for a large section of the society. TMT offers healthcare assistance to people living below the poverty line through a network of hospitals. As part of a cooperative partnership between hospitals and TMT, patients are treated at lower rates in several hospitals. In addition, our generous donors enable us to bear a share of the costs for diagnostic, procedural and medication fees.

The hospitals that TMT has partnered with include government-run Sanjay Gandhi Post Graduate Institute of Medical Sciences,



King George's Medical University and Balrampur Hospital in Lucknow. A majority of the patients were treated at the ERA's Hospital in Lucknow with the direct support of the Canadian Jafari Muslim Foundation in Toronto, Canada.

The Life Saver Program is offered through us by the Sajjadiyya Trust in Toronto, Canada. More than 65 critical care patients in life-threatening conditions received intensive care treatments under the program.

# A new lease of life

Mr Ali, a 48-year-old embroidery worker, lives in a 500sq ft tin shade house with his wife and four children. He earns around Rs. 3000 per month. Three of his children have received educational assistance from TMT- his elder daughter completed B.Com from Shia College and is now married, another daughter completed Intermediate, and elder son has completed class X. Mr Kazmi's younger son, aged around 9 years, is enrolled in class III.

Mr Kazmi suffered from cardiac ailments which was making routine life extremely difficult for him. He was initially treated at Era Medical College from where he was referred to SGPGI. TMT paid more than one lakh on his operation which was successful and has enabled him to live a normal life.

Kudos to **M/s Islamic Humanitarian Services (IHS)** of Canada who sponsored the cardiac surgery and helped the breadwinner of the family resume his normal life.








# **Combined Graph of TMT & Canadian Principal**


## **Head wise Income**




# **Head wise Expenditure**




# **Combined Graph of Educational Aid**
